Some Highlights

1841

College Opens

The first Headmaster was Rev. Alfred Philips and there were 120 pupils.



1886

Edward Wilson

Joined as a pupil, and later became a noted polar explorer, artist, scientist and medical doctor.



1896

First Rugby Match

The first ever school rugby match was played against Rugby School, which Cheltenham won 13-5.



1904

William Herbert

As a pupil, he discovered comet C/1911 S2, becoming fellow of the Royal Astronomical Society.



1920

Kumar Duleepsinhji

Joined as a pupil. A first class cricket competition in India, is named after him.



1872:

The first Cricket Festival was held at College.

1924:

OC Philip Neame (Hazelwell, 1906) VC, DSO wins Olympic Gold in shooting.

1939:

College is evacuated to Shrewsbury School at the start of World War II as the Government took over the building.

1994:

OC General Sir Michael Rose (Cheltondale, 1958) serves as Commander United Nations Protection Force during the Yugoslav Wars.

2018:

Nicola Huggett becomes the first female Head of College.

1973

Patrick White

A novelist who won a Nobel Prize for Literature.



1981

Chandos House

The first bespoke girls' boarding house opens.



1991

Her Majesty the Queen

Visited college to see the Information Technology, Science and Technology departments.



2003

Rageh Omaar

The OC who was Somali-born, made his name as BBC correspondent in Iraq.



2021

First International School

The Cheltenham College's first international school, Cheltenham Muscat, opened in Oman.

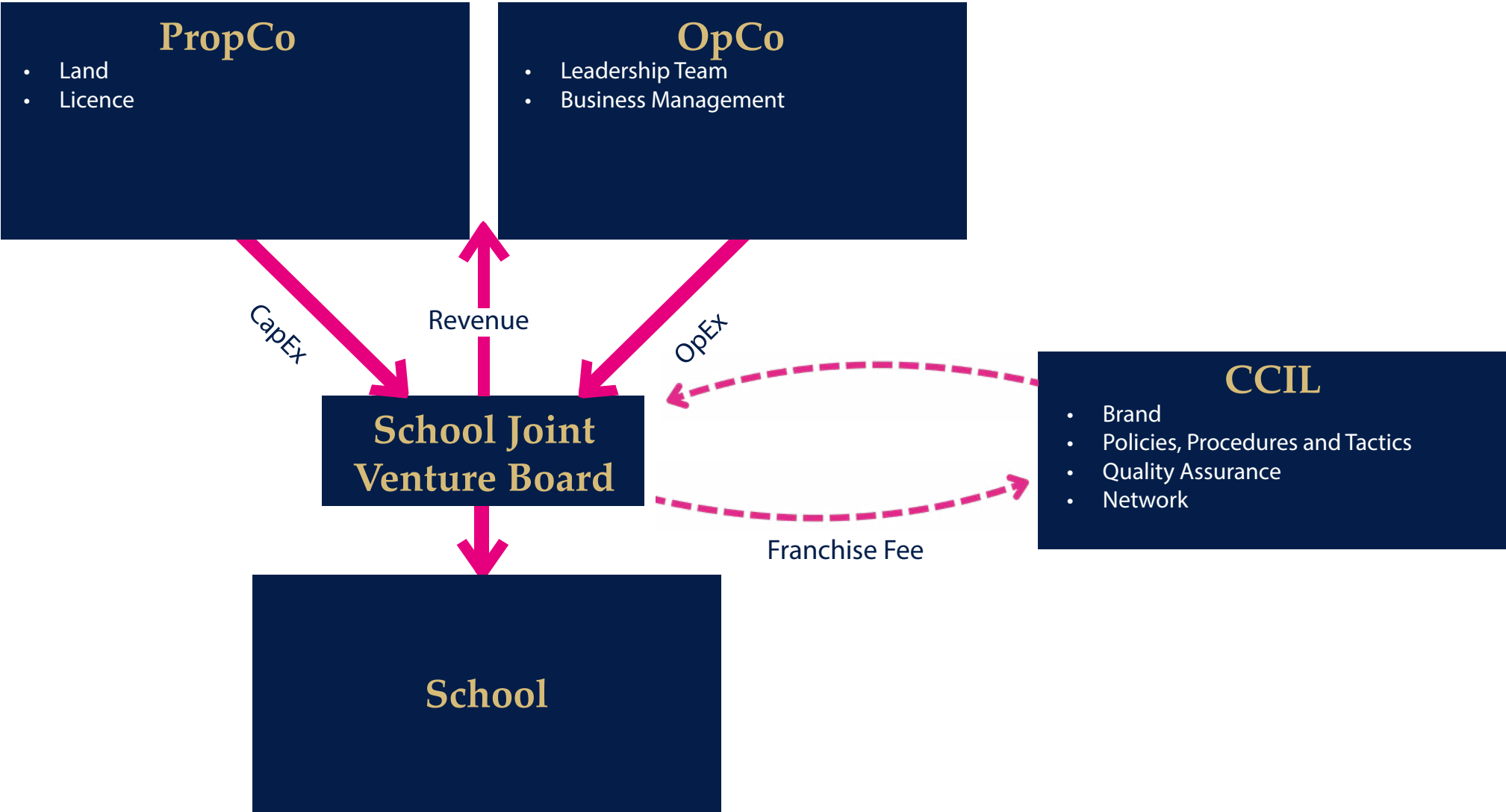

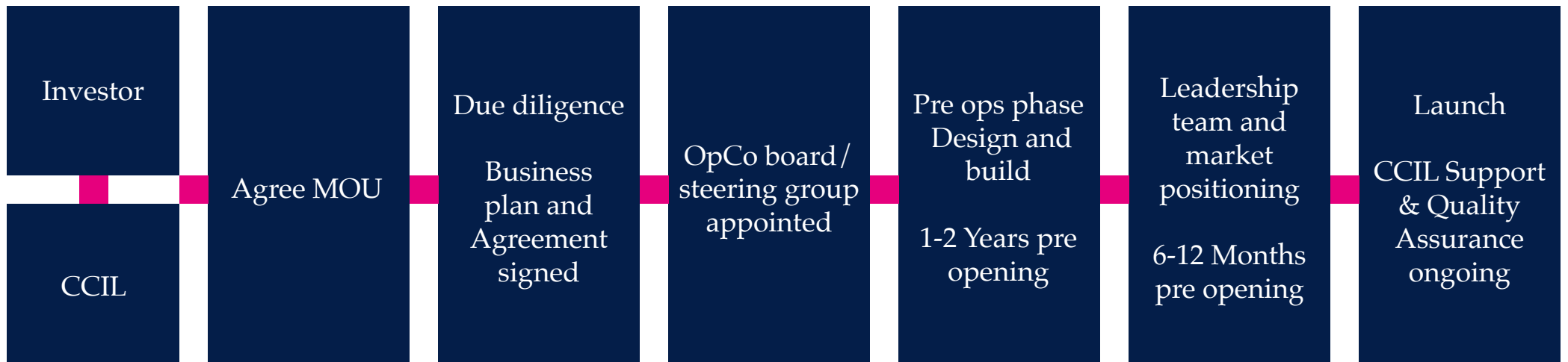
Possible Structure
