



ROWING COACH – Zero Hours

The Post

The Rowing Coach will be responsible to the Head of Rowing and Assistant Head of Rowing who, in turn, reports to the Director of Sport. Rowing Coaches lead coaching sessions with groups of junior rowers. A key part of the role is to energise and enthuse College pupils and teach them excellent fundamental rowing skills. Experience of rowing at all levels and/or coaching is essential.

Specific Responsibilities

- To coach a group within the squad to a high standard and, in conjunction with the Head of Rowing, be responsible for implementing the training program and coaching systems needed to take the Boat Club to success.
- To assist with land-training sessions.
- To show a commitment to safety and to implement safety protocols and systems as required under the direction of the Head of Rowing.
- To have a vision, commitment and ambition to support systems which will aid the continued development of the Boat Club, its site, and its equipment.

- Experience in rowing and/or coaching rowing.
- Coaching experience with young people in sport.
- Able to motivate others, especially those within their rowing squad, and foster teamwork at every opportunity.

Terms and Conditions

- Zero Hours (though hours are expected to be around 10 per week during College Term Time)
